Facilities

2017 has seen the opening of a new of new Cycle Sport facilities across the region, these include:

- The Brownlee Centre, Leeds – 1.6km Closed Road Circuit
- St Thomas a Beckett School, Wakefield – 1km Closed Road Circuit
- Ennerdale Leisure Centre, Hull – 1km Closed Road Circuit

This equates to Yorkshire region opening 7 new cycling facilities across the region since 2012.

New projects that are due to open in late 2017 / 2018 include:

- Leeds Urban MTB park – Middleton Park, Leeds

The British Cycling regional development team continue to support all these facilities to ensure increased participation across all aspects of the sport. We will also work with new partners to help and support the development of new projects as an when they progress.

Highlight report

Regional Go-Ride Coaches

- Chris Young & Kim Meadows continue to deliver Go-Ride coaching across the region. This work covers three main areas: Schools, Club Support & Promotional activities. Both coaches have delivered a high number of coaching sessions in 2017 to over 5000 young people across Yorkshire (as of August 2017).

HSBC UK City Rides

- HSBC UK Go-Ride will be present at both Sheffield & Leeds City Rides. In July 2017 the Go-Ride activation zone had over 350 young people taking part in challenging coaching activities and we hope for similar numbers in September at Leeds

Go-Ride Regional Conference

- The regional development team hosted the first ever regional based Go-Ride conference in March 2017. The event was extremely well attended and had workshops that aimed to develop both coaches and club volunteers in the regions Go-Ride clubs.

Coaching & Education

- Yorkshire region has hosted 11 coach education courses throughout 2017. These range from Level 1 qualifications, Level 2, Level 2 Road, MTB & Track. This has resulted in a number of newly qualified coaches working across Yorkshire.

Future Plans

Core Cities

- Sheffield – Adverts have recently been released for two new Go-Ride coaching positions based solely in the city. It is envisaged that the new coaches will be in position by September 2017. The coaches work will be guided in partnership by both British Cycling & Sheffield City Council. The regional development team continue to help, support and input in to the core city action plan for Sheffield.
- Leeds – Work is still ongoing to establish an action plan for Go-Ride coaching & Young person development across the city. This work is near completion and coaching / Go-Ride developments will be announced before the end of 2017.

Coaching & Education

- 2018 Coach Education plans for the Yorkshire Region will be released shortly but will aim to continue the growth in the number of courses and coaches being developed.
- Courses planned for the remainder of 2017 include:
 - Level 1 – 1st & 7th October 2017 – UAK, Keighley
 - Level 2 – 9th & 10th September, 2nd December 2017 – UAK, Keighley
 - Level 2 Road – 14th & 15th October 2017 – Wakefield
 - Level 2 CX – 9th & 10th September 2017 – Leeds

Go-Ride & Regional Conference 2018

- Dates are being finalised for the 2018 regional Go-Ride conference. Following the success of the 2017 event, the current plans are to expand the 2018 event to incorporate other areas of cycle sport and coaching. The development team is working in conjunction with the regional events officer to develop a format that will incorporate aspects of cycle sport as well as coaching and club development
